
Until the 2016 summer holiday, the entrance to the museum will be housed in a temporary building. For a cup of coffee or tea, visit the 'Poffertjes' stall (34) which serves tiny sweet pancakes on the edge of the welcoming Zaan Square. Or take the old-fashioned tram to Stop C, where you will find the Café De Viersprong (75) and the Hanekamp Inn (62).

Our top 10 for kids (and their parents)

Every weekend and every day during holiday periods, we organise enjoyable activities for families. However, there are also plenty of other things to do. Our tips: From April to June, you can play the exciting *Smuggling Game* (Smokkelspel) and from July to September you can discover how houses and farms used to be built and try the techniques yourself with *Building Fun* (Bouw Mee).

- Step on the tram and visit the *Depot* (51)
- *Zaan Square* with toys (34 and surroundings)
- Bleach the sheets - *Laundry* (39)
- Visit the blacksmith - *Forge* (48)
- Take a ride in the stagecoach - *Van Gend & Loos* (50)
- Child labour, not in my time - *Steam-powered dairy* (52)
- Meet the farm animals - *Petting meadow* (Knuffelweide) (stop D)
- *Playground & Maze* (63)
- *Children's activity farmyard* (73/74), with 'Party! In the Netherlands' from 1 July
- *Paper Mill* (90)

Guidebook

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Good to know

- Dogs (on a lead) are allowed in the museum but not in the cafés, restaurants or exhibitions.
- Parking tickets are available from the information counter and the ticket office.
- First-aid facilities are available in the museum park. Please ask our staff for assistance. Three Automatic External Defibrillators (AEDs) are also available.
- The museum closes at 5 pm!
- The terms and conditions for visitors to the Open Air Museum can be consulted at the information desk.

Walking route

To see everything at the Netherlands Open Air Museum you really need to spend a whole day here. However, if you do not have much time, we recommend that you follow the route below (duration: approx. 2 hours). We hope you'll be able to come back and visit us again another time!

From the entrance pavilion turn left towards the **horse-driven oil mill (3)**. Walk on to the **Moluccan barracks (10)**, via the **farmhouse from Vierhouten (4)**.

Continue to the **farmhouse from Hoogmade (12)**, then head towards the tram stop, via the footbridge, and cross over the tram track.

Walk past the **large farmhouse** and alongside the Zaan lake and cross the bridge to the Zaan

area. There you can visit the **Marken fisherman's cottage (36)** and the **boatyard (35)**. On the Zaan square you will find a convivial '**poffertjes**' stall (**34**) selling tiny Dutch pancakes and the **baker (32)** is famous for his currant buns.

Walk on, following the hedge, and visit the **laundry (39)**. After that, you can follow the path to the **forge (48)** and, further on, next to the tram track you can

visit the **Van Gend & Loos goods shed (50)** and the **tram depot (51)**.

As you leave the depot, take the path that runs between the depot and the tram track on your left and turn left when you get to the crossroads.

You can now visit the **farmhouse from Midlum (53)** with its exhibition about the emigration that took place from the province of Friesland. Retrace your

steps a little way and visit the '**Freia**' **steam-powered dairy factory (52)**.

Then walk on along the front of Freia and, after the little mill, turn right towards the **day labourer's cabin (58)**.

Carry on further and cross over the tram track to the **Hanekamp inn with its maze and playground (63)**. Wander through the **herb garden (65)** and then go on to the **children's activity farmyard (74)**.

Continue your walk by going to the **brewery (78)** and the **workers' houses from Tilburg (79)**.

Afterwards, cross over the track and turn right in front of the **Delft wind flour mill (92)** towards the **paper mill (90)**. Walk back past the **Rietveld holiday chalet (91)**, turn left and head back to the entrance and visit the **Amsterdam Westerstaat (99)**.
